CHRYSANTHEMUMS

Staging and Judging Rules for Chrysanthemums

An Exhibition Bloom must be at least 152mm diameter. A Decorative Bloom under 152mm. An Anemone Type has a round dome-shaped cushion centre with outer petals straight. A single Chrysanthemum has from one to five rows of petals. A Cut is a spray of three to six blooms.

A Natural Spray is of any number of blooms.

DAHLIAS

Staging and Judging for Dahlias

Pompones, Charms, Nymphae, Miniature Cactus, Miniature Garden Cactus, Miniature Decorative Cactus. Staging unit is three blooms to a vase. Large decorative dahlias 190mm diameter and over. Medium decorative dahlias 152mm and under 190mm. Small decorative dahlias 70mm up to 150mm diameter. Large garden cactus dahlia 177mm and over diameter. Medium garden cactus dahlias 152mm and under 177mm diameter. Miniature garden cactus dahlias 114mm and under 152mm diameter. Exhibition cactus dahlias large at least 15mm diameter. Exhibition dahlias miniature 120mm and under 152mm. Charm dahlias must be over 76mm diameter and under 120mm. Pom pone dahlias must be not less than 38mm diameter and should not exceed 42mm. Nymphae dahlias not less than 114 mm diameter and not more than 152mm diameter. Each dahlia to be named where possible. Judging shall be under the Standards of the Horticultural Council of NSW.

3. The Judges decision shall be final.
4. Any embellishments unless stated otherwise
5. Drapes permitted
6. All containers must be collected between 10am and 12 noon on Sunday and no responsibility can be accepted for their safety.
7. Limit size of arrangement to 24" wide.

To be judged under the Royal Horticultural Society Standards for Traditional Floral Art. Use of mutilated material in this section will not be accepted.
