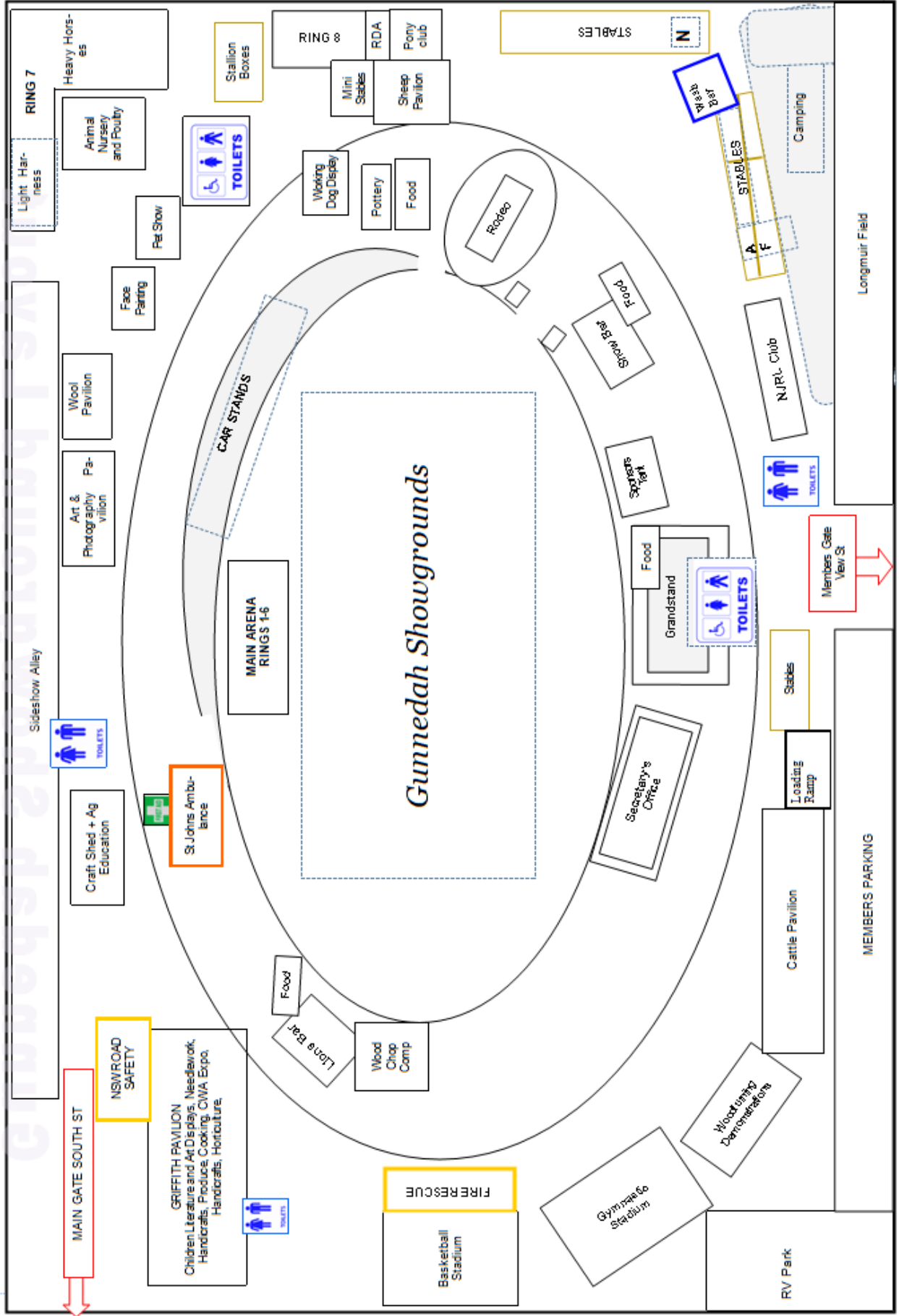

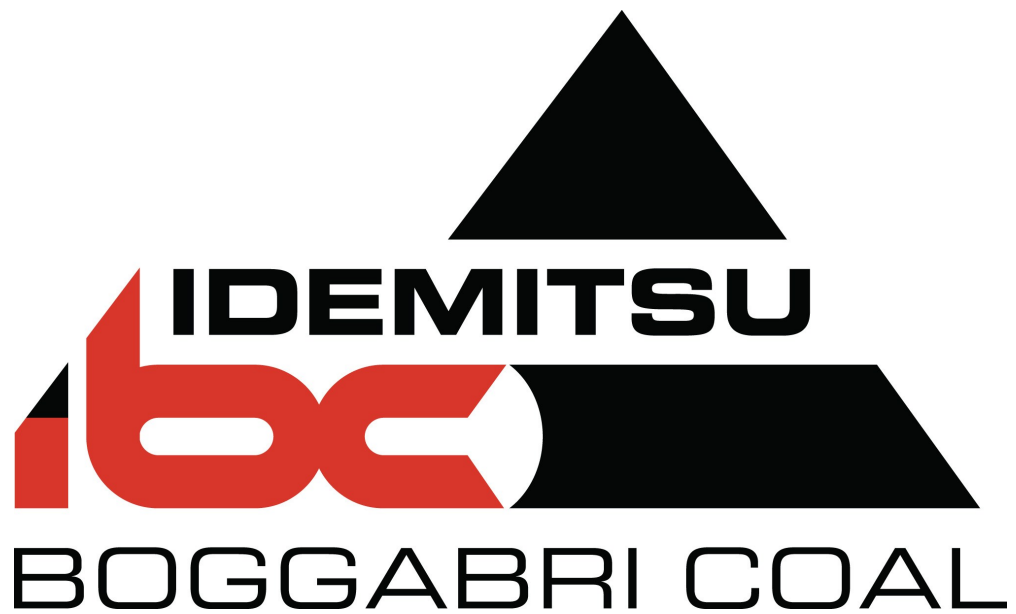

3. Every care will be taken of exhibits, but the committee will not be responsible for any losses damage or faults. All persons / organizations compete / exhibit at their own risk, notwithstanding the existence or otherwise of a signed entry / nomination form.
4. No late entries will be accepted except under the discretion of sectional convenor.
5. The decision of the **Judge will be final** except where a protest or complaint in writing is lodged with the Secretary on the ground on the day of the show within three hours after notice of award has been issued.
6. The protest must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00, which may be forfeited if protest is found to be frivolous. All protests and complaints will be dealt with by the disputes committee from whose decision there shall be no appeal.
7. See Other Sections for Regulations and Conditions relating to their particular sections.
8. Perpetual Trophies will be presented to the winner and immediately returned.

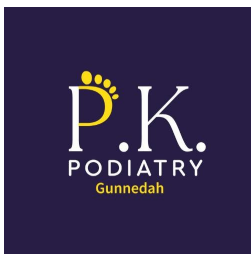

RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

The following recipe is **COMPULSORY** for all entrants - Section C28—Rich Fruit Cake

Ingredients:

250g (8oz) sultanas
250g (8oz) chopped raisins
250g (8oz) currants
125g (4oz) chopped mixed peel
90g (3oz) chopped red glace cherries
90g (3oz) chopped blanched almonds
1/3 cup sherry or brandy
250g (8oz) plain flour
60g (2oz) self-raising flour
¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg
½ teaspoon ground ginger
½ teaspoon ground cloves
250g (8oz) butter
250g (8oz) soft brown sugar
½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind
½ teaspoon almond essence
½ teaspoon vanilla essence
4 large eggs

Recommended Method:

- * Mix together all fruits and nuts and sprinkle with sherry or brandy
- * Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight
- * Sift together the flours & spices
- * Cream together the butter and sugar with all the essences
- * Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures
- * Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
- * Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin & bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ —4hours
- * Allow the cake to cool in the tin

Note 1: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces

Note 2: The height of the cake should not exceed 57mm or 2¼ inches

This will be voted on by the public and awarded after the completion of the exhibition.

Sections

1. **PAINTING** *Sponsored by Gunnedah Newsagency* 1st Prize: \$150, 2nd Prize: \$50

Any painting medium, including oils, acrylics, watercolour, gouache, etc.

2. **DRAWING** *Sponsored by Hamcott Pty Ltd* 1st Prize: \$150, 2nd Prize: \$50

Any drawing medium, including pencil, pen, pastels, inks etc.

COLLECTION OF ARTWORKS: Sunday, 6 April 2025. Between 10am - 12pm at the Art & Photography Pavilion. * *After this time, artworks can be collected from Gordon Barry & Co, Chandos Street, Gunnedah.*

Conditions of entry

- Works must be the entrant's original work and not previously exhibited at the Gunnedah Show.
- Each entry should have its name, address, title, section, and price (or NFS) clearly indicated on the reverse or in an appropriate area not visible to the viewer for 3D artworks.
- All works must be dry, mounted, or framed with hanging equipment attached. Works not ready for hanging will not be included in the exhibition (This will be enforced for health and safety regulations - works will be turned away if not ready to hang safely).
- Artworks must not be too large for hanging; please keep all work under 1.25m².
- No more than one large, maximum-size work will be accepted per entrant. Sculptures and ceramics must have a stable base or similar for display purposes.
- No exhibit can be entered into more than one section. Gunnedah Show Society reserves the right to move entries into different categories if we deem it is appropriate.
- All entries will be judged, but the Show Society reserves the right to withhold any work considered unsuitable for hanging, and the judge's decision is final.
- The Show Society reserves the right to have any entry reproduced in the press, online social media, or telecast.
- All possible care will be taken with the works, but the entrant is responsible for all transport and insurance costs. The Show Society will not accept any liability for loss or damage in transit, at drop-off or collection points, or while on exhibition.

In sections 1 - 6, entry fees are \$5 per artwork; in Section 7, entry fees are \$1.

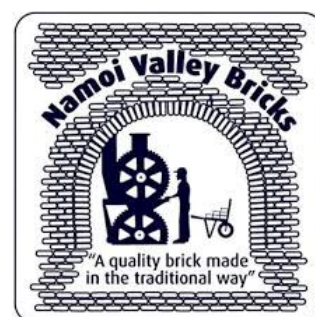
Sale information
